## A BILL

To allow for cooperate research activities between the Department of Homeland Security and Taiwan to strengthen preparedness against cyber threats and enhance capabilities in cybersecurity, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "United States-Taiwan
- 5 Advanced Research Partnership Act of 2023".

1	SEC. 2. COOPERATIVE HOMELAND SECURITY RESEARCH							
2	AND ANTITERRORISM PROGRAMS RELATING							
3	TO CYBERSECURITY.							
4	(a) In General.—As part of the international coop-							
5	erative activities authorized under section 317 of the							
6	Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 195c), the							
7	Under Secretary for Science and Technology of the De-							
8	partment of Homeland Security, in coordination with the							
9	Secretary of State and other appropriate Federal officials,							
10	may enter into cooperative research activities with Taiwan							
l 1	to strengthen preparedness against eyber threats and en-							
12	hance capabilities in cybersecurity.							
13	(b) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date							
14	of the enactment of this section, the Under Secretary for							
15	Science and Technology of the Department of Homeland							
16	Security shall submit to Congress a report consisting of							
17	a status update on the progress of forming, executing, or							
18	implementing agreements with Taiwan for cooperative ac-							
19	tivities to strengthen preparedness against cyber threats							
20	and enhance capabilities in cybersecurity. Such report							
21	shall also detail any administrative, legal, or diplomatic							
22	challenges or resource constraints relating to such agree-							
23	ments or activities, as the case may be.							
24	(c) Prombition.—No additional funds are author-							
25	ized to be appropriated to carry out this section.
